

### Producer's note

Following our hugely successful production of Peter Pan last year, it was always going to be a really tricky task to choose a show this year that could match it. In the past, the choice of show has always been down to the committee and producer, however, in recent years this decision has been given to the members themselves - the committee narrows it down to 3 potential choices and then the members vote for their favourite - such a great idea, and this year, Jack was the most popular choice.

With a pantomime cow, a magical beanstalk and a giant to contend with, it would be a challenge to produce in a small venue such as our lovely Woodmead Halls, and, with the budget of a small amateur company who relies on fundraising and donations.

But everyone who knows me, knows I love a challenge. And, I am super lucky to have an amazing team to work with: Amanda, choreographer, Harvey, Musical Direction, Hilary, wardrobe mistress, Carl, scenery and large props, Michaela, stage manager, Jane, small props and of course, Dave, Will and Ant on the sound and lighting - a show like this could simply not happen without them. I have an idea, write a list, draw a picture, and it's them that I trust to bring it to life. I am not sure they realise how grateful I am.

There are many scripts available, and we read numerous different options before choosing one; I particularly liked this one by Joshua Dixon because it had a strong, traditional storyline throughout with laughs a plenty.

I like to visit at least one professional panto a year - it is great for sparking creativity and picking up ideas that can be brought back and used. So, in December, I took a trip to London to check out the 2023 Palladium Panto, which, coincidentally, was also Jack & the Beanstalk.

Bursting at the seams with big names - Julian Clary, Nigel Havers, Paul Zerdin, Dawn French - and with a budget of around £2 million - I expected to be wowed. As it was, at the end of the show, I was left somewhat underwhelmed. Don't get me wrong, there was an impressive set, inflatable beanstalk reaching to the roof, dazzling costumes, animatronic giants - but I had the overwhelming feeling that predominantly, it was simply a showcase for the big names.

Because of the focus on the celebrities, the actual story of Jack got lost somewhat, with the iconic 'chopping of the beanstalk' almost an afterthought. As a result of what I saw, I came home actually feeling even more proud of what we have achieved here in little old Lyme Regis.

The people you will see on stage tonight, along with front of house and backstage, all come from different walks of life, but we do what we do simply because we love it.

We are excited to show you the results of the last 5 months of planning and rehearsing - thank you for your support. I know you will enjoy the show!
